

"My folks moved around a lot while I was growing up, and while I was always a pretty sharp kid who loved to read, I developed a serious "attitude" problem in junior high while attending McKinley Junior High in Cedar Rapids. It was a pretty scary school and my younger sister developed a brain tumor around this time and was in the hospital for a very long time. My folks were busy with her, and out of guilt and lack of oversight I started hanging out with a very rowdy group.

After picking me up at the police station a couple times, my parents moved to Mount Vernon to turn me around. I arrived at the very wholesome MVHS in 9th grade, wearing a jean jacket with a big marijuana leaf on the back. Mr. Ringold singled me out right away as someone to watch closely. It was a big adjustment. During this time, late 70's, kids who smoked and got into trouble were called "scoops" (as I soon found out, as I was called that)...

Within maybe 6 months, I started dating a popular boy in wrestling and his sister, Jude Smith (my dearest friend to this day) made friends with me and I started normalizing. We both took lots of art classes with Donna Swenson. My grades were rotten in 9th grade and my prospects weren't great, but by 10th grade I was getting straight A's and by our senior year Mrs. Swenson was taking us to visit lots of companies using artists/designers of varying types, and she was giving us college level course materials. Donna really believed in us and pushed us hard. She was so "matter of fact" that we didn't question the fact that we should go on to college and study design. I went on to

Iowa State University and received a degree in Graphic Design, ultimately moving to California and working for toy companies including Applause and for customers including Paramount Studios, Warner Bros., Children's Television Workshop (Sesame Street), Jim Henson, Charles Schulz/United Media (Peanuts), etc.

Donna and I wrote letters over the years and I spoke to several of her classes when I was home during the school season. We always traded Christmas cards.


I was shocked and greatly saddened by her death. I feel she still looks out for me and urges me on. Whenever I feel I can't do something in my career, I picture her face telling me "yes you can!" She was a great teacher. "

### Mustangs...what are they doing now? LINDSEY BORG '83



Air Force Lt. Col. Lindsey Borg, a 1983 MV graduate, is commander of the B-2 stealth bomber mission support squadron at Whiteman AFB, Mo. He took command of the 200person squadron in July 2004 and expects to be reassigned in July 2006.

Lindsey is a 15-year veteran who began his Air Force career after graduating from Iowa State University in 1989 with a degree in journalism and mass communication.

"I had the outstanding opportunity to serve as a White House intern during the Reagan administration," Borg said. "I returned to Iowa State from that experience knowing I wanted to serve our country. I extended my time at ISU to complete the two-year ROTC program."

Borg said his plan to serve four years, then return to lowa, changed as time went by.

"The Air Force has continually presented me with terrific opportunities and experiences. It's hard for me to believe 15 years have passed; they've gone quickly despite seven household moves."

Borg served the first 14 years of his Air Force career as a public affairs officer and will likely return to that work when he relinquishes command of the B-2's mission support squadron. "This opportunity to command a squadron is unique for me as a public affairs officer," Borg said. "I'm thrilled by the chance to broaden my skills and experience base."

In recent years, Borg has been assigned to the Pentagon, NATO Headquarters in Belgium, and the Air Force's European headquarters in Germany. While assigned to the Pentagon, he served as the Air Force representative to the Joint Chiefs of Staff planning group that created the public affairs plan for Operation Iraqi Freedom and the system for embedding journalists with combat forces. Extended deployments have taken him to Homestead AFB, Fla., in the aftermath of Hurricane Andrew; to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba; Sarajevo, Bosnia-Herzegovina; and Pristina, Kosovo.

"I highly value my Mount Vernon roots," Borg said. "The Iowa work ethic, strong emphasis on education and solid values are keys to success in any line of work but match the Air Force's focus very well."

Borg and his wife, Deb, a Cedar Falls native, met while students at Iowa State. They have two sons, Tanner, 9, and Nathan, 7.

### DONNA ZINKULA MCKAY '74



Congratulations to alum Donna McKay from the Class of 1974, who was named the 2006 National Cheerleading Coach of the Year by the National Federation of State High School (NFHS) Spirit Association.

One of the founders of the Iowa Cheer Coaches Association (ICCA), no one has impacted cheerleading in Iowa more than Donna McKay. From her duties at the local level in Mason City, to her varied roles with the ICCA, to her involvement with the NFHS at the national level, McKay has given many hours to cheerleading activities. McKay is responsible for 60 cheerleaders at Mason City. A teacher and basketball coach for 28 years in the Mason City schools, McKay has guided her cheer teams to three state titles during her 20-year tenure. A total of 86 Mason City cheerleaders have been selected to Iowa All-State teams.

In addition to many team spirit awards, McKay's team members have been involved in numerous community service projects. One of the major team projects has been to mentor elementary students. Her teams have raised money for Juvenile Diabetes Research, Hospice of North Iowa, New York Firefighters 9-11 Disaster Relief Fund, Make a Wish Foundation and Walk/Run for the Cure. In 1994, the Mason City High School cheerleaders raised \$15,870 for the V Foundation for Cancer Research.

Donna was a cheerleader here at Mount Vernon High School, and she also cheered at the University of Northern Iowa. A charter member of the ICCA, McKay has served two terms as president (1992-94 and 1998-00) and currently serves as ICCA secretary and ethics director in charge of arranging all rules meetings and clinics. ### Graduates of Mount Vernon class of 1986 send kids off for first day of school

Donna Griebel, Julie Lynch, Polly Blythe and Sharon Grice attended the same kindergarten class in 1973. They remember the bus rides, school picture days and their high school graduation in 1986.

Now these Mount Vernon-area residents have something else to add to their memories of going back to school in the community: the first day of school last fall 2005 when their five-year-olds started kindergarten together at Washington Elementary.

On this Monday afternoon in the park, the children of the four friends are getting acquainted as well. Blythe's daughter, Lisa, Grice's son, Christopher, Lynch's daughter, Barbara, and Griebel's daughter, Macey, are not in the same classes at Washington Elementary, so this is the first time the whole group has gotten together. "They're getting to know each other," said Blythe, who co-owns Polly Ann's Antiques and the Blythe Cottage Inn with her husband, Bob.

Although many of the educators the four friends remember from their school days have retired, including long-time elementary teacher Barbara McClain, Blythe said that she recognized some familiar faces when she walked Lisa through the same halls she walked as an elementary student. "Kids can still walk and ride their bikes to school," said Griebel, a communications assistant at CIPCO and mother of three. "I remember you knew at least somebody every couple of blocks."

As the four friends talk and reflect back on their years together in school and after, Lisa comes running from the new playspace at Washington Elementary and asks her mom for a drink. This brings back memories of a fourth grade field trip, when a teacher told the girls they should suck on their thumbs if they were thirsty. Lynch, a nurse at University of Iowa hospitals, said she remembers exactly when she met the other three. They used to ride the bus together and play at recess.

Grice remembers how Griebel used to wear her hair- long and tied up with a bow.

Polly wasn't having such a good hair day when she got her kindergarten picture taken. It must have been after recess, she said, "because my hair was going every which way."

The friends also remember the piano in their kindergarten classroom, and the painting shirts they wore for art class. The building hasn't changed that much, even after 30 years.

Grice, the associate director of admissions at Cornell College, said she had mixed feelings dropping Christopher off for his first day of school. "I did just fine until I got out to my van then the tears came," she said.

Blythe laughed, saying, "my husband and I were counting the days down. We were very much ready for school to begin." But when the time came to say goodbye, Blythe and her husband found themselves lingering in the classroom long after the other parents had left. "I would love to have a video of the first day," said Blythe.


Griebel recalls that when Macey came home from her first day, she told her mom that, according to the teacher, all 20 students in the class were going to be one big family. Macey told her mom that she really didn't want to have 20 kids in her family. But by the time she, Barbara, Christopher and Lisa have graduated from high school, Macey may have changed her mind.

### School District Improvements 2005-2006

The new high school building construction has taken the spotlight in the school district during the 2005-2006 school year, yet there have been many other improvements in the schools over this past year.

• The new Washington Elementary School playground was opened in June to the delight of young and old.

• The architects are finishing the plans for the remodeling of the current high school building into a middle school. Construction bids are expected to go out in May with construction completed in December, 2006.

• Plans proceed for how the previous middle school building next to the football field (which was also the previous high school building) will be used after the current middle school moves to its new building. The Superintendent's office will move to that building along with the Student Transition Center. The Mount Vernon Area Arts Council has expressed interest in setting up studios in the building and there are also businesses interested in renting space.

• High school teachers and administrators have been meeting with representatives from the Clear-Creek Amana Schools and the Grant Wood Area Education Agency to discuss changes to the current educational approach and how it can be redesigned to better prepare students for the ever changing world environment.

• The middle school has implemented and continues to modify a team teaching approach to education that promotes better communication among teachers regarding students, better communication with parents and students, and allows teachers to work together on various classroom units.

• The middle school teachers are beginning to implement a Character Counts program to help fortify student values.

• A new middle school/high school assistant principal position was created to manage student attendance issues and help students with disciplinary issues.

• The high school teachers continue to make changes to the high school schedule to provide more academic opportunities for students as well as provide them with more guidance regarding their high school classes and how those classes relate to their plans after graduation.

• The high school has volunteered to host the Iowa Academic Decathlon State Contest in 2007. Planning for this event has already begun. This will be a significant event in the community and will also be an opportunity to showcase the new high school building.

• The district is planning to add more summer academic classes this year to provide students an opportunity to further enrich their educational experience.

• This past year the high school developed a Student Success Lab to assist students in their classes.

• The teachers in the district have started a structured mentoring program among teachers to discuss teaching improvements and collaborate on informational resources.

• A new communications council has been formed to allow a representative teacher from each building to meet monthly as a group with the superintendent. This group discusses questions and facilitates communication to resolve any issues or concerns. • The district is currently working on a new school newsletter format that is printed by The Sun newspaper. This new format promotes expanded communication to parents and the community.

• And the new high school building is on schedule to be completed and opened before the start of the 2006-07 school year. With about 80% of the work completed on the building, it already looks like an impressive high school building both inside and out. Although the building will be completed about August 1, it will truly be complete on August 23 when both faculty and students are in the building working together on the first day of school.

The Mount Vernon Schools appreciates its partnership with the Mount Vernon School Alumni. Without alumni support, the advancement of educational excellence for the next generation of Mount Vernon alumni would not be possible.
