

# VIKTOR DONATES TREE TO SCHOOL DISTRICT

The school grounds of the Mount Vernon Schools campus are park-like and well-tended, but when the new high school was built two years ago, the building sat in the midst of only a few plantings. Allan Viktor'69 who owns a local tree nursery, contacted Superintendent Schwiebert asking if he could help by donating a tree. He didn't mean just any tree, as now a 14-year old, 28 foot tall Northern Pin Oak is gracing the front of the high school. It was planted on May 1st this spring and is12" in diameter.

Allan says "The High School looked bare with out any large trees around it. Being two stories tall, the building needed a huge tree immediately to balance out the looks of the school. Adrian Ringold (former principal and superintendent) suggested that I donate the tree in memory of my father Paul."

Allan explains "My father served on the school board when the 1971 High school was built. He was very proud of the fact that the 1971 High School was nice looking and built at a cost of \$11 per square foot, when the schools being built in Cedar Rapids cost over \$17 per square foot. Originally Paul was asked to serve on the board by three board members when another member resigned because they were moving. My father was farming full time, working full time as a draftsman at Square D Co. in Čedar Rapids, and a farm manager for a small group of farms near Swisherm Iowa. He told them he was too busy to serve. One of the board members said: "We want someone who is too busy; they are the ones who get things done!" Feeling honored, my father couldn't refuse. In fact my father helped plant this tree when it was a seedling in 1994.



# Mustangs...what are they doing now?

### RICHARD 'DICK' BOWMAN'58

A successful attorney and managing partner of his own firm, Dick is owner of honors from 'The Best Lawyers in America' and the Minnesota Law & Politics Magazine 'Super Lawyer.' He has first chaired cases in more than 30 states and was most recently recognized by Honda for outstanding service and 20 years of success in defending their company. He has authored several articles on product liability and is a frequent speaker. He has appeared on the McNeil-Lehr News Hour and has testified before Congress and the Consumer Product Safety Commission regarding products liability. Following is an excerpt from information he wrote for his class's reunion Memory Book.

"After high school, I graduated from Cornell College, was offered free rides to either Duke or Chicago University of Law School or University of Minnesota Law School. I didn't know where Duke was, I did know where Chicago was and I had just fell in love with a Minnesota girl, so I chose Minnesota (logical? not)...I have tried cases in over 30 states and our office has gone to jury verdict in all of the 50 states except Delaware. So I have lived my life on the road going from trial to trial....After being clumsy all my life, I was talked into ballroom dancing lessons and for about ten years my wife Terri and I competed in contests around the country...We didn't make any money so I couldn't quit my day job, but we had lots of fun....I have flown my hot air balloon in several states and have also flown several times over the alps in Austria at a competition held the second week in January. Among the 44 European teams they allow two American teams. One of the five years we participated we WON. Also got to take the balloon to Leningrad, USSR in 1990 and flew from a different tsar's palace twice each day with the 50 teams worldwide. The Russians had never seen hot air balloons, so the crowds were electrified and fantastic to behold."

Dick put together a conglomeration of memories from Mount Vernon, enjoy... "I have lots of great memories of good old MVHS, and some before: of the one room country school house where my sis and brother and I attended for 2 years before it was closed and we were bused to town, no indoor plumbing, no electricity either, two holer outside.


To get permission to go "outside", you raised your hand with one finger if your mission would be short, and two fingers if prolonged (the dozen kids in school always laughed if two fingers were raised.) My class was the largest; there was my brother and me and one other kid. We attended 3rd grade in "town school" where everyone wore jeans, we didn't. We wore the high front bib overalls and work shoes. Our parents soon allowed us to have jeans and low cut shoes and then "town" school felt a lot better.

Our fifth grade teacher was named Mr. Reyburn. I recall him being very upset at the class when he was shot in the eye with a squirt gun. Charlie Sloan was our band instructor when I was in 7th grade. I recall him directing us all, that if we couldn't hit the right note, to at least hit it LOUD. As I recall we all complied with this instruction.

For those of us who were active in dramatic arts, declamation and speech competitions, we were fortunate to have Charlie Kraus as not only our english teacher for most of high school, but our speech, debate and declam coach too. We almost always wiped up the floor with our competition at state speech contests, and Mr. Kraus gets a lion's share of the credit for that. Because of him I grew up thinking it was normal to be on my feet speaking in front of an audience, and he taught all the aspects of effective speech which I still use in court and teach our younger lawyers to employ.

Our football coach Don Hipple was famous for always admonishing us before each game to "LEAVE IT ALL ON THE FIELD BOYS. DONT SAVE ANYTHING FOR THE BIG POST GAME DANCE." And apparently we followed his advice because I think we won the conference





championship my senior year, a tribute to Mr. Hipple, Mr. Bergman and to our newest coach Jim "red dog" Miller, who "treated" those of us who dogged it in practice to a one-on-one blocking and tackling exercise after practice. Even though he had NO PADS and NO HELMET, we who were fully protected always got the worst of it.:)

My memories of Ken Smykil are most fond, playing in the polka band with him on tuba, trying to get out of marching with the band at half time even though I didn't make the football team my freshman year, concerts, festivals, trumpet trio, trumpet quartet, brass sextet, music contests, solos, and he hung in there for all of them. He must have been pretty darn good too, because we usually kicked '####' and took awards at state music contests too.

No trip down memory lane would be complete without Lois Nichols. All the guys were in love with her; she was beautiful, bright and effervescent, and fun to learn vocal music from. Even guys who didnt like to sing signed up for chorus, men's glee club and small choral groups such as quartets, madrigals etc. and Lois always walked off with all the bacon when she sent us to music contest too. These are a few of my teacher memories."


