

Alumni Association Names Award Winners

Four Mount Vernon High School graduates received the first-ever Alumni Awards from the Mount Vernon Alumni Association during halftime at the October 3rd Homecoming football game, and were also recognized at the annual Alumni Association meeting Saturday, October 4th. Winners were named in four categories: Achievement, Service, Fine Arts and Athletics.

Jean Minish Stoner'37 - Service Hall of Fame

Jean was nominated by Lisa Squiers White'88 and Ann Stoner. "When we found out about this award, Jean was the first person to come to mind," White said. "She is a model citizen in so many different ways. She is the quintessential candidate for this award."

In their nomination, White and Stoner said: We would like to nominate Jean Minish Stoner for the Alumni Service Award. After moving to Mount Vernon in 1931, Jean graduated from Mount Vernon High School in 1937 and attended Cornell College, graduating in 1941. She married Virgil Stoner, also an alum, from the class of 1933. In addition, all five of her sons, three daughtersin-law, her 12 grandchildren and one great-grandchild have or are attending school in Mount Vernon. Jean has been a homemaker, a substitute teacher, volunteer and continues to remain active in the family farm, paying farm accounts, a role she has maintained for over 67 years. Her volunteerism is exemplary as she has been active in numerous organizations doing service-related work and has logged hundreds of hours annually for the past 60-plus years.

As a current member of the Mount Vernon Alumni Association, she is the sponsor for the Class of 1937. Jean has helped with several projects from initial organization of classes, alumni breakfasts, as a resource for historical facts about the school and she was a donor to the original capital campaign. However, this is just a small portion of Jean's lifelong commitment to service and volunteering.

Starting in the early 1950s, she coordinated 30 workers at a flu shot clinic in Mount Vernon that treated more than 1,200 people. In that same decade, she was instrumental in the establishment of a special education class at Mount Vernon High School.

Jean remains a member and has been a past leader of several organizations, such as the Social Circle Club, United Methodist Women, Federated Mount Vernon Lisbon Women's Club, and Iowa Mothers Association, to name a few.

From her experience doing mission work at her church, she started and coordinated workers for a used clothing room at the Southeast Linn Community Center. Jean has used her sewing skills to produce thousands of baby quilts, lap robes and twin bed comforters for these groups: Smiles, Madge Phillips.

Additionally, her interest in history has found her volunteering for several years at the Cedar Rapids History Center. She used her experience there to begin working and helping others organize the Lisbon History Center and has logged in excess of 700 hours. She also has written articles for the Sun regarding the history of Mount Vernon and Lisbon.

Jean's energy and enthusiasm for life belie her 88 years. Even the adversity of a recent illness has not stopped her from staying the course of her volunteer work.

Dr. Gary Knutsen'65 - Sports Hall of Fame

Nominator Reid Hanley'64 of Clarendon Hills, Ill., submitted this information with his nomination for Gary:

There have been enough outstanding athletes at Mount Vernon in the last 20 years to more than fill a Hall of Fame. I think it's also important to remember those in the 1950s, 1960s and even earlier.

Gary Knutsen was the leading rusher in

the state of lowa in 1965 and earned Coaches All-American honors that season. He was a four-year letterman in football, basketball and track. He was a four-year starter in football, basketball and track and also started one year in baseball. He earned all-conference honors in football and basketball his three final seasons (on a team or honorable mention).

As a senior, he was the leading scorer in the conference in football and basketball and was the conference shot put champion. He led MVHS to the conference basketball title his junior year. He also earned All-State mention his senior year in both football and basketball. He went on to play football at Cornell and became one of the top fast-pitch softball pitchers in the state.

Mount Vernon has been fortunate to have some great athletes. It is important not to forget the Gary Knutsens, Randy Hoidahls, Bob Bowmans and Bob Kruses who helped set the standard of excellence at MVHS.

After graduating from Cornell, he earned a master's degree in veterinary physiology from lowa State. After founding Pathology Associates in 1981, he sold it in 2001. At that point, it employed 550 people. He currently is president of a digital pathology software company, is CEO of a toxicological pathology company and is involved in a firm that manages alternative investments.

Marcia Russell'89 - Fine Arts Hall of Fame

Marci's nominators were her older sisters and twin brother - Sheri Russell Arnold'82, Linda Russell Brooks'83, Trina Russell Allen'84, Julie Russell Lynch'86 and Mike Russell'89.

In an interview with the Sun, Sheri Arnold noted, "She is a wonderfully caring person. She's dedicated to both her profession and her family. She puts others before herself. She brings humor to everything, and that's one reason her students just love her."

In their nomination, they wrote: Marcy is a 1989 graduate who has made significant contributions in the area of music. She has received numerous prestigious awards and honors, as well as touched the lives of hundreds of people along the way through teaching and performing.

Marcy is an outstanding member of the music profession and a wonderful role model for her students, family members and everyone else she encounters. We believe she would be a perfect candidate to become the first inductee into the MVCSD Fine Arts Hall of Fame.

She currently is a vocal and general music teacher in the Platteville, Wis., School District, where she directs high school and middle school choirs and select ensembles. She has directed numerous high school and middle school musicals and served as a private voice teacher.

Dr. James Croft'47 - Achievement Hall of Fame

Dr. Croft, who is married to alum Diana Pringle Croft'46, was nominated by David Wolfe'50 who included this information in his nomination:

Croft has had a lengthy career as a music educator, teaching at Florida State University (1980-2003), University of South Florida (1972-1980), Oshkosh Area Schools (1954-1972) and Traer Public Schools (1951-1954).

He served as president of the National Band Association, CBDNA (Southern Division) and CBDNA (National). Honors include: Distinguished Alumni, Cornell College (1989), Distinguished Alumni Fellow, University of Oklahoma (1994), National Federation of Interscholastic Music Associations Music Educator Award (1990-91), FSU Professional Excellence Program recipient, Distinguished Service to Music Award from Kappa Kappa Psi, and FMEA Collegiate Teacher of the Year.

His resumé also lists numerous published writings, music premieres as a performer and numerous examples of conducting a variety of bands and symphonies.

In a tribute, Bobby Adams, Ph.D., described Croft as "intellectual, creative, imaginative, complex, analytical, brilliant, interesting, unpredictable, amusing and clever beyond belief."



SUN EDITORIAL: What an education! (from October 8th issue of the Sun)

For many, the term High School Homecoming simply makes you think about a football game, maybe a parade, and a dance for the kids.

After this past weekend, Mount Vernon shows it's as much about coming home, celebrating your roots, and honoring what's been grown here. And MVHS did it with style!

We speak mostly of work done by what's become a very strong institution over the course of four short years – the Mount Vernon Alumni Association. Examine all of the organization's efforts and you'll quickly realize it rivals the alumni groups of many small colleges.

This isn't an organization that simply acts as a clearinghouse for those who have MVHS diplomas. It celebrates what that means. This weekend provided a perfect example, as the Alumni Association honored four alums with the first annual Alumni Awards.

Our first reaction: Wow, what a group!

Gary Knutsen has been a world leader in pathology work – and he was recognized for his prowess as a Mustang with a Sports Hall of Fame Award. Another, Marcia Russell, was honored as a Fine Arts Hall of Famer, for her dedication and care as a music teacher in Wisconsin. Jean Stoner has spent a lifetime focusing on all things Mount Vernon and might as well be called Mrs. Mustang, particularly with all five of her sons, three daughters-in-law, 12 grandchildren and one great-grandchild attending school here. Bestowing the Alumni Service Award on her is a perfect fit. James Croft, fittingly, was presented the Achievement Award for his numerous national accomplishments as a long-time music educator.

Most amazing is the fact that the list has not been exhausted. Not even close. We know of dozens of other former Mount Vernon students who have the perfect qualifications for the Alumni Association's four award categories.

Additionally, this year's group (and, we're sure, the award winners to come) are diverse. This isn't a hall-of-fame that only focuses on sports. It's not just an award program to celebrate what grads did in high school, leaving out their later accomplishments. It's all-encompassing.

As a sidenote, we're also wondering if Mount Vernon shouldn't be the community the State of Iowa turns to for insight into reducing the brain drain. After all, numerous successful alumni live right here in the Mount Vernon area, from bank presidents to insurance company CEOs to small business owners.

We should also make this disclaimer clear: Only one member of the *Sun* newspaper staff is a graduate of MVHS. This isn't cheerleading for our own school. Not because they believe they would be better if they had gone to school in Mount Vernon.





MV ALUMS MEET AGAIN AT U OF IOWA MEDICAL SCHOOL

Medical school is challenging enough with so much to learn to become a physician. There's new jargon to acquire, medicines and disease groups to memorize, and remembering where to go for lectures or rounds. Add to that meeting new peers and instructors and it can begin to feel overwhelming. But for a group of Mount Vernon and Lisbon area alumni, it isn't quite as intimidating. They are fortunate to be one of eight fellow alumni attending medical school at University of Iowa's Carver College of Medicine.

"It's nice because you automatically have someone you can connect with," explains fourth year medical student **Jamie Wallace '01**. "It gives you a friendly face in the hallway, or a member of the class ahead of you to loan you books, or someone to give you advice as you go along."

Medical school entails four years of highly specialized schooling; two years focusing on gathering medical education through lectures and classes, and two years making clinical rotations throughout the hospital in all the medical specialties. Following graduation, medical students enter into at least three years of residency, further honing their clinical skills until they complete their training. It is a grueling schedule over many years, so having a built-in support structure from fellow alums is helpful.

"Carver College of Medicine is fortunate to have a number of Mount Vernon area high school alumni currently enrolled in medical school," describes Carver Assistant Dean of Catherine Solow. "They are successfully completing a rigorous curriculum and the leadership they demonstrate outside of the classroom enhances the learning environment for all students. Their impressive achievements reflect well on Mount Vernon and make them excellent role models for all who are considering a career in medicine."

Carver College of Medicine echoes the importance of students having a sense of community like the automatic connections Mount Vernon area alumni share. The Carver medical school is organized into "CELLS" which offer peer-to-peer

support, education, leadership and service learning. MV alums liken the CELLS to the houses in the Harry Potter books, but there is no mistaking the fact students benefit from peer connections. Students are able to learn more effectively and efficiently while reducing the isolation they can feel.

Many of the Mount Vernon graduates credit their decision to enter medical school to the quality education they received before entering college.

"Plenty of teachers helped shape who I am today," **Jessica Enns '00** states. All the MV grads echo her sentiment because of the quality instructors and unique experiences they were able to have here.

Lisa Fettkether Schwiebert '02 explains she was always interested in medicine growing up, but the Emergency Medical Measures class she took in high school led her to additional experiences in college which cemented her decision to attend medical school. While in college, she participated in a medical mission trip to China. "It was a great experience that allowed me to see how much I could improve the lives of others through medicine."

In the areas of math and science, "Mr. Halsey and Mr. Craig taught me the basics," reported Jessica Enns '00. Other



grads named Mr. Thomsen and Mrs. Poduska as being influential in many ways, while others said Mrs. Sauter and Mr. Eric (Butikofer) "made tough subjects much easier to understand." It wasn't just the science and math teachers students cited as being helpful to their education, but staff members such as Ms. Michaud, Ms. Ellison, Ms. Richardson, Mrs. Ryan and Ms. Deibner who broadened student experiences. "I was given an excellent foundation and I believe a long string of teachers spurred me on towards a career in medicine," Rachel Young '03 emphasizes, "And I am proud to be a Mount Vernon alum."

Lisbon schools graduate **David Easker '03** took classes at Mount Vernon during high school, and was able to participate in combined athletic teams. "My interest in medicine began while watching the Mount Vernon athletic trainer (Jeremy Elliott '89) work with students," he admits. "My interest was confirmed as I learned about physiology and biochemistry in college."

"I can't think of a better place to grow up than Mount Vernon," Jesse Vislisel '03 acknowledges. Over the course of his education, Vislisel explains he has developed a deep interest in both science and technology. "I have found medicine to be awe-inspiring because it allows me to combine my interests and skills to perform intricate work."

2001 graduate **Catherine Hileman** recalls experiences in middle school and high school while in Mount Vernon to be influential in her career decision. "There were teachers in every subject and every grade who made education in Mount Vernon a memorable experience and sparked my curiosity." Hileman continues, "I especially loved the teachers who challenged us to think critically, as well as encouraged imagination and creativity."

The extracurricular activities students experienced in Mount Vernon High School also played an important role in shaping their education. Fourth year medical student **Greg Poduska '01** recalls a trip to Alaska for the national Academic Decathlon tournament being "a definite highlight" of his high school years. "I always enjoyed being part of the various extracurriculars available," he states. "All the teachers who gave their time to coach, instruct and help with these activities were wonderful."

All of the Mount Vernon schools graduates echoed a similar sentiment: the experiences they gained while in school helped shape who they are, and what they will do in life. It may not be unique to have two graduates attend college or graduate school together, but the large group of Mount Vernon alumni attending University of Iowa's Carver College of Medicine is special. It speaks to the quality education and guidance all these students received from Mount Vernon's staff members.



Mount Vernon alum heads for wild, blue yonder

The sky's the limit for Mount Vernon native Carlye La Pointe as she prepares to become a pilot in the U.S. Air Force.

La Pointe, now 26, has taken her own path and been recognized for her hard work as she has advanced in her military training.

Her motivation is straightforward. "I can't see myself doing anything other than being in the Air Force," she said. "It's important to serve my country."

After graduating from Mount Vernon High School in 2000 and earning an associate's degree from Kirkwood Community College, she was at a crossroads: It was either transfer to lowa State University or join the military.

"My granddaddy had retired from the Air Force," La Pointe said. "He always had good things to say about it." By May of 2003, La Pointe had enlisted and was at basic training at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas.

From there it was off to training as a photographer at the Defense Information School at Fort Meade in Baltimore. She was named a distinguished graduate in December 2003.

She was assigned to MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa, Fla., as a photographer. During her time there, she was engaged in a year-long process of applying for a SOAR scholarship that allowed her to be released from her enlistment to attend college and enroll in ROTC. La Pointe, currently a Cadet Lieutenant Colonel,

will be a 2nd Lieutenant when she graduates in May 2009 with a business management degree from the University of South Florida.

La Pointe's honors don't stop there. She is now part of an elite group that is attending pilot training. Of the 844 non-Air Force Academy applicants, 502 were selected.

"I would always get a little carsick when I was younger," La Pointe said with a laugh. "But I've taken some flying lessons and built up my tolerance."

In the fall following her graduation from college, she will attend Flight Training School in Colorado, then receive training specific to the type of aircraft to which she will be assigned. "I want to fly the big cargo planes, the C-5s or the C-17s," she said.

All along the way, La Pointe has been recognized time and again for her distinguished work and her leadership. After her field training, she was one of four group commanders who had their prop and wings medal pinned on by a general.

Mount Vernon alum's lifesaving efforts recognized

Paper carrier Adriana Hartelt Boettcher'91 of Mount Vernon was recognized Aug. 8, 2008 at the lowa State Fair for her lifesaving efforts on two separate occasions. Adriana's route is in Mount Vernon.

While delivering at the Chapel View Apartments, she heard the call of an elderly man who had fallen. The man, who was a Hurricane Katrina evacuee, asked her to come in to his apartment. She found him on the floor, called police and waited for paramedics to arrive.

Later that same winter, she discovered an elderly woman in the snow who had gone out at night without her hat and gloves in sub-zero weather. She had fallen, and her body felt cold to Boettcher, who wrapped her in her scarf and hat, and summoned police.

"I didn't think much of it at all at the time," she said. Boettcher did, however, mention it to one of her customers, Dean Borg of Mount Vernon, while she was telling him why the paper was later than usual. Boettcher said Borg gives her cocoa in the winter. Borg, in turn, nominated her for the award. "I had no idea it was in the works," she said.

"The paper route is supplemental income," Boettcher said. "I have a lot of loyalty to my customers, many of whom I haven't met."



Middle school football coach earns prestigious award after 32 years

No one was more surprised than Mount Vernon Middle School Football Coach Bill Thomsen when he found out he was the winner of the lowa Football Coaches Association's top honor.

Thomsen, 54, who has coached for 32 years, received the Don Taft Junior High Coaches Award at halftime of the 2008 Class 3A championship at the UNI-Dome. A Mount Vernon native and Cornell College graduate, he taught and coached for five years in New Hampton before returning to teach and coach in the MV School District for the past 27 years.

"I'm proud. I'm pleased. I think longevity has a lot to do with it," Thomsen said. "There's nothing about (coaching) I don't enjoy."

Thomsen keeps a busy coaching schedule, handling middle school football and wrestling and serving as the high school girls' track coach. He's quick to lay the credit at his athletes' feet. "There's a tremendous clientele in Mount Vernon. The talent is there," he said. "We're blessed with a lot of talented athletes."

If there's one thing he hopes the athletes he coaches take from him it's that they recognize the passion and dedication it takes. a part of the team," he said. "We're not always measured in a win-loss record."

Thomsen has a straight-forward coaching philosophy: "I will take the blame, and I want them to get the credit. I really like to take the pressure off and let kids be kids." That's not to say he isn't asking a lot of his athletes, and Thomsen said he works out alongside the students and tries to be a good role model.

Thomsen lights up when asked about what he has learned from his young athletes. "I love the effort, the variety - every kid's different," he said. "To see a kid who's semi-interested make a hit" and grow makes it worth it.

Despite the amount of time Thomsen spends involved in athletics, he's no one-trick pony. He's played everything from a cowardly lion to an ugly step-sister in community theater productions, and he's not afraid to get on stage and sing. "I think being a performer carries over," he said.

Years ago, when he returned to Mount Vernon, he taught physical education. He currently teaches math and health, but has previously taught reading, English and science.

Reachout serves 29 Palms, Joshua Tree, Yucca Valley and the surrounding areas and are a stand alone non-profit. Their largest program is the Transportation Program which provides rides to health care appointments. They own two vans and run them five days a week. Monthly they travel over 3,500 miles.

Ron, a driver of one of the vans, says "I take seniors and disabled people to medicial appointments. I average about 2-3 thousand mikes a month."
