PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Through the fall of 2010 our annual Alumni Awards was an independent functioning event occurring concurrently with Mount Vernon Community School District's homecoming weekend. It was held over a two-day period with events taking place at the Friday night football games, cumulating with an awards ceremony the following Saturday morning. In the fall of 2011 we began expanding this annual alumni event by integrating

Achievement winner Graham Harman'86 (Greg) traveled all the way from Egypt to accept his award. Graham is currently the Associate Provost for Research Administration and Professor of Philosophy at the American University in Cairo, Egypt.

Graham is a contemporary philosopher of metaphysics, who attempts to reverse the linguistic turn of Western philosophy. Harman is associated with Speculative Realism in philosophy. He works on metaphysics, the study of the ultimate nature of reality, which he pursues in the form of an object-oriented philosophy.

After graduating from Mount Vernon High School in 1986, Harman attended St. John's College in Annapolis, Maryland, receiving his B.A. in 1990. He then pursued graduate study under philosopher Alphonso Lingis at Penn State University, receiving his M.A. in 1991. He transferred to DePaul University in Chicago where he received his Ph.D. there in 1999. While in Chicago, he worked briefly as a sportswriter for sportsextra.com (now defunct). Since 2000, he has been a member of the Department of Philosophy at the American University in Cairo.

Nominator and fellow classmate Deb Winchip Douglass says of Graham, "He is a world-renowned philosopher and publisher. Do you know that they have conferences to discuss his work? Even in high school Graham was a high academic achiever and was on the Academic Decathlon Team." Searching our youngest Hall of Fame Achievement recipient's name on the internet, you will find that there are almost 70 solid pages of Graham Harman before other names appear.





Graham is the author of 10 philosophy books and more than 80 articles, the co-editor of another philosophy book, and the translator of 3 books from German into English. He is a popular conference speaker and symposium paper author (with over 120 international lectures on five continents), and a 2009 winner of the AUC Excellence in Research and Creative Endeavors Award.

Fine Arts winner Margaret 'Maggie' Quinn Ellison'62 was a familiar face around Mount Vernon until her death in 2011 at the age of 67. Maggie was nominated for this award by her son, Vince Ellison'92. As a student Maggie was involved in high school Fine Arts activities including the Velvet Curtain, Talent Show, Mixed Chorus, Girls' Glee, All-School Play, Declam (speech), Pep Band, Marching Band, Concert Band, and the Chalkmark. She was also involved in varsity cheerleading and was a member of the Homecoming Court.

Maggie's love for drama continued after high school. She received her degree in teaching from Drake University in 1966, then taught in California, Maine, and ten years as a professor at Cornell College before coming back to Mount Vernon High School. She taught English and drama, and directed all but one fall play and a spring musical each year for 25 years before retiring in 2008. After retiring she immediately became re-involved with the Mount Vernon-Lisbon Community Theatre as both a board member and participant in productions.

Maggie loved Mount Vernon as her home town. Her grandmother arrived here in a covered wagon, and her mother and children are also Mount Vernon alums. Donna Jacob, a retired MVHS English teacher, said Ellison likely became interested in teaching because of her own high school teacher, Gladys Rife. Her son Vince wrote that "Maggie was loved by her students, and she sincerely loved them back. For Maggie it was never about who got the accolades, but about getting in the game and participating. She encouraged involvement in the fine arts no matter how small the role or contribution." Alex Morf'99 wrote "Mrs. Ellison had a profound impact on me...and was one of the biggest supporters of my interest in the theatrical arts. I owe a great deal of my success and drive as an actor to the nurturing I received from her. As someone who lives and breathes the fine arts every day of his life, I know of no one more deserving (to receive this award)." Former MVHS principal Tom Madson said "Maggie was the key element in making the speech and drama programs excel year after year." A scholarship to honor Maggie was given for the first time in 2012 to a MVHS grad 'with a dedicated interest and passion in the humanities.'

Service winner Dolores 'DeDe' Staskal Hicks'50 flew from California to receive her Hall of Fame Service Award. She was nominated by classmate David Wolfe. While most people from the Class of 1950 are enjoying a leisurely retirement, DeDe spends her days as President and CEO of The Voluntéer Center for South Bay-Harbor-Long Beach. There she is responsible for total administration and operations of this non-profit organization which serves as the hub of volunteer activities for 600 nonprofit organizations in 43 cities. In addition DeDe has spearheaded many fund-raising activities, including a million dollar Capital Campaign, instituting improvements in existing programs and developing new programs through an active community outreach campaign. The Center has been recognized as the #1 Volunteer Center in the United States. The Hall of Fame Award for Service though does not recognize these amazing accomplishments, but rather is given to recognize her amazing volunteer background.

In her volunteer work De De has played a continuous leadership role in numerous charities and nonprofit organizations. This long list includes past president of the Community Association of the Peninsula (CAP), where she coordinated all activities. The largest volunteer group on the Peninsula, CAP has a mem-

bership of 1,400 families, assets of \$5.4 million and an annual operating budget of over \$500,000. CAP received President Reagan's Presidential Citation for its model youth program. In addition she has been a board member for the Mary and Joseph Retreat Center, a member of the Gamma Phi Beta Alumnae Association, Founder of the Information Center for the Peninsula Community, Founder of Legacy (promotes donor organ transplant education), and is a past president for a variety of associations, councils, and clubs including the Associates of Palos Verdes Community Arts Association and League of Women Voters of the Palos Verdes Peninsula. She is a past board member of the Norris Theater for the Performing Arts, and Charter member of Act II (support group for the Norris Theatre) and League of Women Voters.

De De has also served as a member of the Marymount College Steering Committee and the Harbor/UCLA Medical Center Community Alliance. She has been involved in a multitude of other civic activities including the Private Industry Council, Community Advisory Council for Dow Chemical, local Chambers of Commerce, United Way, Peninsula Seniors, founder of Four Circles (assistance for orphanages), Stoneridge Homeowners Association and Care Clinics for Women.

Among her more than fifty honors are YWCA Woman of the Year, Everyday Hero, Magnificent Woman Award, Media Arts, Marquis 'Who's Who of American Women', 'Who's Who in Finance and Industry', 'Who's Who in the World', Katy Geissert Volunteerism Award, VanDine Americanism Award, Most Outstanding Volunteer Award by the Torrance Area Chamber, and most recently in 2009 the Citizen of the Year award by the Palos Verdes Peninsula Lions Club.



Athletic winner John Hearn'75 was nominated for his award by his father, Raymond Hearn. John, an individual who loves athletics, excelled as a student and now as a Coach. During his high school track and field career John earned 35 individual meet championships, was Drake Relays qualifier, 7 individual district championships and collected 5 state place finishes. During his junior and senior year John was 'Most Valuable Track Athlete' and Team Captain. He set four track records: the 880 Yard Relay, the 440 Yard Dash, the One Mile Relay, and the Mile Medley Relay. He was the Eastern lowa Hawkeye Conference (EIHC), and Indoor Champion of 60 yard High Hurdles, Medley Relay and Mile Relay. During high school John earned letters in football and track. He was a member of the State Runner -Up Football Team and the State Champion Football Team. In his senior year of football, he earned both EIHC 2nd Team All-Conference and Honorable Mention All-State recognitions.

John graduated from Coe College in 1979 where he was active in football and track and field. As a junior and senior at Coe, John earned the Clem Wilson Award as Most Valuable member of the track team and the Thelma Lab Award for most dedicated in Track and Field. The Midwest Conference Championship won in his senior year was the eighth consecutive Midwest title won by the track and field men for Coe College and John was voted Team Captain. He also finished 8th place at the Division III National Championships in the 4x400 relay. John earned three varsity letters in football and four in track. In track he ran the 400 meters and was 2 time Midwest Conference Champion and four-time Midwest Conference Champion in the 4x400 relay. He was a school record holder in both 400 meters and the 4x400 meter relays. In football he was defensive safety and was 1st Team All-Midwest Conference; Defensive Back his senior year. He was inducted into the Coe College Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996.

In 1979, following his heralded high school and college career, Coach Hearn began his science teaching career at Dubuque Senior High School where he was also named head cross country coach. He served as wrestling coach from 1982 to 1985, football coach from 1980 to 2000 and 2009 to present, and track and field coach-from 1980 to present. He was Mississippi Valley Coach of the Year in Track and Field in 1993, 1994 1995, 1996 and 1998. He was lowa Association of Track Coaches Assistant Coach of the Year in 1987, 1993, 1994, 1995, and 1996. Coach Hearn was awarded the lowa Football Coaches Association Service Award for 15 years of service and a 25 year Service Award from the lowa Association of Track Coaches. He was also Runner-Up Teacher of the Year for Dubuque Community Schools in 2004.

A community effort to update historic football field bleachers and athletic facilities.

The "Save a Seat" campaign is a community-driven effort to raise funding to replace the existing Mount Vernon football field cement and wooden bleachers with a modern, more easily accessible metal bleacher system. The proposed metal bleachers will almost double the seating capacity of the existing portable metal bleachers and fixed wooden bleachers combined!

Purchase a seat to save a seat.

"Saved" seats are not "reserved" seats, but are a thank you and a tribute to those who donated. Any new monetary gift will be acknowledged with a permanent, metal plaque affixed to the new bleachers. Plaques will be inscribed with the donor's or honoree's name. Plaque color denotes the level of donation. Giving levels include a \$100 Bronze, \$250 Silver, \$500 Gold, and \$1000 Platinum. The plaques will include no more than 2 lines of copy. Plaques will be placed according to gift amount with bronze plaques affixed to the the bottom rows, silver above bronze, gold above silver and platinum the top rows.

Any level plaque can by purchased by any person, business or organization. For example, families can purchase one plaque for a family name or individual plaques for individual family member names. Alumni could purchase one as a class or an individual. Plaques can also be purchased as memorials or remembrances. Multiple plaques can be purchased. All gifts are tax deductible through the Mount Vernon School Foundation.

Goals and the future

The "Save a Seat" campaign's initial goal is \$150,000. That amount would purchase materials, engineering, site planning, and labor. Any moneys raised above the original goal would go toward other athletic facility improvements. About \$80,000 has already been raised.







What have you been doing since you left Mount Vernon High School? I graduated from MVHS in 1977, so a lot has happened since then. I graduated from Cornell College in 1981 with double major in mathematics and biology and enjoyed playing both basketball and football there.


After some travel, graduate school and teacher training, I taught mathematics and coached basketball at a suburban Chicago high school for three years. Although admittedly a bit idealistic in my youth, I went into teaching because I considered it a worthwhile and noble profession – and because it provided the opportunity to work just about anywhere. Wherever people live there are schools and, hence, teaching jobs.

I first explored the possibility of teaching overseas after my first three years of teaching when I took the 1987-88 school year off and spent some of the time traveling around Europe. I visited my brother Jim (1980 MVHS grad) who was living in West Berlin at the time and through the kindness of Lynn Berry (fellow 1977 MVHS grad) I was connected with friends of hers that were studying in Warsaw. Traveling through East Germany, Poland and several other communist Eastern Bloc countries was fascinating.

While in Poland, I met some teachers working at the American School of Warsaw – an international school with students from all over the world.

On my way back to the USA, I traveled through Western Europe and took the opportunity to visit several other international schools. One of these visits turned out to be a significant turning point in my life. While in Britain I traveled up to Scotland and was immediately struck by the beauty of the countryside and the friendliness and humor of the people. I visited the International School of Aberdeen in the far northeast of Scotland and to my good fortune they offered me a teaching job. I taught at the school for four years during which I met and married Val (who is from Elgin, Scotland north of Aberdeen). We left Scotland in 1992 and embarked on a 10-year journey during which we moved five times, welcomed three children to the world, taught at schools in four different countries (Switzerland, Norway, USA and Denmark) and then unexpectedly ended up back in Aberdeen working at the school where we first met.

During my international teaching career, I've been able to challenge myself professionally having worked as the Head of Mathematics at three different international schools, published in mathematics education books and journals, and frequently speak at conferences and deliver teacher workshops for teachers at international schools. Now in my 28th year of teaching high school mathematics (21 of those outside the USA), I still thoroughly enjoy teaching and though I may not be as idealistic as I once was I still think it is a worthwhile and noble profession.

How did you end up in the country you are in now?

After we taught two years at Copenhagen International School (2000-02), my wife and I were offered jobs at our former school in Aberdeen, Scotland. A big reason for accepting the offer and returning to Scotland was the opportunity for $u\bar{s}$ – and especially our three young children (ages 2, 6 & 8 at the time) - to be near my wife's

How long have you lived there, and how long do you think you will live there? I have now lived for a total of 15 years in Scotland and still enjoy the cultural, historical and physical landscapes of the country. If you don't mind the changeable weather, short winter days and low population density, life in northern Scotland is good. We live in a small village near Aberdeen about 10 miles from the North Sea (Atlantic Ocean) and the biggest mountain range in Britain is about 25 miles in the other direction. After graduating from high school last year, our oldest daughter is teaching English for a year in rural Dominican Republic and after that she will study Spanish and History at Glasgow University – so, though we've considered moving again, Scotland is a good place for us.


What do you do now?

I am the Head of Mathematics at the International School of Aberdeen. The school

has an elementary, middle and high school all on one campus with about 550 students from about 35 different countries. Most of the families that send students to our school are in Scotland to work in the offshore oil and gas business that has existed in the North Sea for about 40 years. During the last two years of high school most of our students complete the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) program. Along with other high school courses, I teach the advanced mathematics, and a required course called Theory of Knowledge, in the IB program. I also coach the senior boy's basketball team of which our 17 year old son is a member.

An accomplishment you are proud of?

Three accomplishments of which I am proud: With a good friend who is a math teacher at an international school in Vienna, I have co-authored two mathematics textbooks for the IB program published by Pearson Publishing. Working on such a big project while also teaching full-time was a real challenge but now I get to teach my students using a textbook that I helped write.

I have organized and lead five different student group trips to Malawi and Zambia (countries in southern Africa) where we have been involved in projects supporting impoverished schools in Lilongwe the capital of Malawi. We also go to an amazing national park in Zambia where we go on safari drives. On the first trip in 2005, I was able to meet up with my brother Jim who was working at the American embassy in Lusaka, capital of Zambia.

I am delighted and astonished that I am still playing basketball at a fairly competitive level. I played in a very competitive league 20 years ago in Switzerland but since then I've stayed in shape mostly by cycling, hiking and the intermittent pick-up basketball game. Five years ago, I started playing seriously again with a team in the top division of the local men's basketball league. I enjoy keeping fit playing twice a week with guys much younger than me but perhaps enjoy the social side of the club even more with our visits to the local pub after games.

A favorite memory or two of your time at Mount Vernon Schools – or of a favorite teacher perhaps?

Although I only attended Mount Vernon High School my last year, I made many good friends and have very fond memories of Mount Vernon having attended Cornell and seeing three of my six siblings graduate from MVHS (John in '77, Margaret in '78, and Jim in '79). Some of the memories from the 1976-77 school year include playing fullback on the football team for Jim Bellamy and basketball for Bob Landis – and coming within just one game from making it to the basketball state tournament. I have great memories of being taught by Dick Peters – and benefited greatly by being a student in a "research" course that he designed where we were challenged to read books that stretched our minds and to write papers on weighty issues. A few years ago, I re-discovered a very ambitious paper I wrote for that course entitled *Does Darwinism Threaten a True Belief in God?* Given my own attempts to get teenagers to think hard about big ideas in my IB Theory of Knowledge classes, I'm even more impressed with Dick Peters and his positive influence on me – and more convinced that teaching is a noble profession.

What have you been doing since you left Mount Vernon High School ? What do you do now?

After leaving Mount Vernon High School, I went to college in Wisconsin, graduate school in Indiana and then spent two years on a fellowship in Warsaw, Poland, where I decided to try to become a journalist. The Des Moines Register kindly published a couple of stories I wrote from Poland. I then returned to the United States and got a job on a little newspaper in Pennsylvania. Two years later I went to work for The Associated Press, first in Philadelphia and then New York.

The AP sent me to Moscow at the end of 1995 and I have been here ever since. I left the AP in 1998 and became an editor, eventually editor in chief, of The Moscow Times, an English-language daily. In 2006, I made my first serious attempt to return to the U.S., but ended up back at the AP Moscow bureau, this time as news editor. I oversee a team of reporters in Russia and in 10 other countries that used to be part of the Soviet Union. As for how long I'll stay, every year, especially as winter sets in, I say I'll give it another year, maximum, and I'm saying it again now.

An accomplishment you are proud of?

What am I proud of? Two things come to mind: The numerous young reporters, many but not all of them Russian, whom I have helped to become accomplished journalists. And my tennis game. Russia has great tennis coaches, and I live with one.

What have you been doing since you left Mount Vernon High School and what do you do now?

As a child I spent many summers camping in the Chiricahuas of south eastern Arizona, where I grew in the midst of the ornithology world. Then after high school, I took an Outward Bound course that helped set the course of my life. With the travel bug itch, I hitchhiked all over the western USA and ended up at Prescott College studying Environmental Education. Following my college years, I spent some time managing a rock and roll band and being a bike messenger in San Francisco before becoming a tour leader at Backroads Bicycle Tours. After more time on the road and in the outdoors, I met and married Jennifer, and settled down as the Operations Manager for Backroads in Berkeley, California. Several years and two kids later, Jennifer and I decided to step out of the mainstream and move to Mexico in 1994. In Alamos, my love of birding was rekindled as I started working with small tour companies that came to town. I'm a self taught birder and now I thrive on running great trips, seeing a lot of birds, eating good food and having loads of fun. Sometimes I feel guilty about what an amazing life I lead. Since 1998 Jennifer and I have operated Solipaso, a destination for bird watching. In addition I give tours for Field Guides, High Lonesome Bird Tours and Borderland Tours. I am also a Mexico subcontractor for several US and UK bird tour companies. While I specialize in Mexico, I also migrate north every May and June to lead tours in Alaska.

How did you end up in the country you are in now?

As I mentioned, Jennifer and I wanted to step out of the mainstream. My step-father, Richard Howells, had bought an amazing old building in Alamos, Mexico. We went to visit, fell in love with the town, the cool old building we ended up calling home and the culture and the community. On our drive back to California, we decided to move there. So in 1994, we left our good life in California and moved to Alamos! We slowly figured out a way to make a living and found it a great place in which to live and work for many reasons, and our commitment to our adoptive country is profound. One major reason that we decided to stay here was the wonderful friendships and partnerships that we have developed.

An accomplishment you are proud of?

I'm especially proud of the business we have developed. Today Solipaso is the largest and longest operating Mexico-based bird watching tour company. We consistently offer more scheduled trips to more areas of Mexico than any other tour company – and I'm really proud of that. In addition, we (Jennifer and I) have always felt that our business had to provide opportunities for local community development in the direction of conservation. Without this critical element, a nature-based tour business is doomed to watch the habitat disappear around them. We are strong believers in nature-based tourism as a real economic force, and realize our responsibility to share the wealth to make that a reality. We are happy to have realized this goal in many ways! From our Bird Guide training programs to our rafting business in Sonora, we work to offer opportunities for motivated local people to work with us. Our long-term goal is to educate people on the need for and benefits of conservation and natural diversity.

A favorite memory or two of your time at Mount Vernon Schools – or of a favorite teacher perhaps?

We can never underestimate the impact we have on the people who share in community with us. Over all of these many years and across thousands of miles, through the experience of differing cultures and the gift of living in many





places in the world, I am still well aware of the spirit of excellence that was a definitive part of my education at Mt. Vernon High School. This was a place where I was shaped to be a citizen of the world.

An early feminist, I can remember that I was the first female student to take wood working and auto-mechanics in a time when these classes were only for the boys! Mr. Stone did his best to accommodate this new student and I learned to change the oil in my car—something that has come in very handy over the years. Having once owned and operated a recreation centre with automatic pin setters for bowling, those mechanic skills served me well.

Perhaps more than anything, it was the diversity of activities at MVHS that helped me to understand how important it is to be a part of a team, large or small. Concert and marching band, speech contest and choir, musicals, cheer leading, baton twirling, and student government were all elements of an education that seemed intent on making students understand that diversity was something to be embraced and celebrated.

I remember devoted teachers like Mr. Stine who came to school early and went home late just to help the students to be the best that they could be. Now that I have had the experience of being a parent, I wonder how educators like Mr. Meeker came to school so well prepared, and wide awake, when raising families of their own! I am grateful for their willingness to put such dedication into their professional lives. It was a great example for students who were going out to pursue careers of their own.

What have you been doing since you left Mount Vernon High School? What do you do now?


