



Storytellers Reflect on Why Mount Vernon Is Home

More than 50 residents attended the "Mount Vernon, Lisbon and Me" storytelling event, sponsored by the Mount Vernon Area Arts Council, Wednesday, July 6, 2022. The event was the first of four scheduled days of activities for the Heritage Days celebration in Mount Vernon this year, and featured the stories of seven residents. Many stories talked about what has made Mount Vernon and Lisbon home to these residents. Here are

Grant Freeman '06 told how Mount Vernon has slowly become home to him over the years. Freeman noted in his later high school years, he viewed Mount

Vernon not as a place someone goes to live, but as a place people go to die. He went to college as far away as he could in Tacoma, Washington, and made a promise never, ever to set foot in the town again. Freeman noted he made several trips back to the community to visit family and friends, and each of those trips seemed to last longer and longer.

Until 2015 when he returned to Mount Vernon. He's been one of the head

speech coaches for the high school since 2015, but every year he submits his resignation, and every September he's accepted the job again. Over the course of the last eight years, Freeman has realized that this town has become his home. "Now, I have no plans of going anywhere," Freeman said. "I'm even considering buying a house and starting a family in this community." Freeman accepted a job this fall with Lisbon Schools as director of plays and musicals for the school, as well as continuing on as head large group speech coach for Mount Vernon.

The last storyteller of the evening was Tawnua Tenley, instructional coach and individual head speech coach at Mount Vernon, who recounted her own journey. Her original career goals

were to be a pediatrician and live in a big city loft apartment after high school.


Her family moved around a lot growing up, and she was never in the same town for more than a few years until she was in her mid-20s. When she was looking to go to college, she first did a few years of service with the military. She married, moved into Los Angeles with her husband and started college. A few years later, she didn't have enough money to continue college, had a failed marriage and a young son, and was struggling financially in Los Angeles. "I'd maxed out my credit cards on groceries and spent my last few dollars on asthma medication my son needed," Tenley said. "I remember a day I was trying to get my son into a daycare, and we had his nebulizer and as I was trying to get into the daycare, the medication for the nebulizer slipped out and hit the floor and shattered. I didn't have the money to replace that medication. That was my rock bottom."

Tenley asked a friend for assistance, which he provided, but asked her what her plans were. When Tenley said she planned to finish college, but couldn't in Los Angeles because it was too expensive, he asked why she couldn't go home with her parents instead? Her family now lived in Iowa City, and Tenley discovered it was a great place to stay and finish college. She applied to Mount Vernon a few years later as a teacher, sending her letters of recommendation to the district and applying to other places as well.

Tenley added she was the graduation speaker for the class of 2003 and the message she shared was that students would find the clarity she had found in her failures that eventually led her to Mount Vernon and the life she had here. "I've had a very rewarding career in Mount Vernon, despite living in a small town, one of the things I never wanted to do," Tenley said. "I truly found home here."

JERRY RINGER

Jerry, who was class valedictorian, participated in band, choir, sports, plays, and musicals all four years of high school. He went on to be a summa cum laude Cornell College graduate, received an M.D. from the University of Iowa College of Medicine, interned at the University of Chicago Hospitals and Clinics, and then completed a residency at Iowa in the Department of Ophthalmology. Before doing his U of I residency, Jerry served in the U.S. Army as a general medical officer, stationed both in Korea and the U.S.

Jerry then worked professionally for 33 years as an ophthalmologist in Bloomington, IL. During his time at the Gailey Eye Clinic, they grew from one to five offices, building their own outpatient surgery center.

He is a member or past member of many professional organizations including the McLean County Medical Society (past president), Illinois Medical Society, American Medical Society, and the Illinois Society of Ophthalmology (past president).


While Jerry doesn't mind spending a Saturday flipping pancakes for the Kiwanis, as a highly respected community member he has been a member of many community organizations, including MARC Center Foundation for the Developmentally Disabled (past president), Illinois Shakespeare Festival Society Board, Senior Professional organization at ISU (past president) for mentoring honor students, Development Committee of the Illinois Prairie Community Foundation, Eversight (Illinois Eye Bank), and member of mission trips to eye hospitals in Zambia, Haiti and Jamaica.

At Cornell College Jerry has been a Trustee for over forty years, and for whom Ringer Hall is named. He was awarded the Cornell College Leadership Award in 1990. Among his other honors are Philanthropist of the Year along with his wife, Carole, by the Illinois Prairie Community Foundation, and History Maker of 2020 along with his wife, Carole, by the McLean County Museum of History.

He says "It was these opportunities that gave me the confidence to do the extra-curricular activities in college and now in my life.... A big 'thank you' goes to the teachers of Mount Vernon schools that gave me the start for a great career and life.'

LARRY RINGER

Today, if you were to visit the public library in College Station, Texas, you would see identification on the building that says 'Larry J. Ringer Library'. From an lowa high school student to a community

leader in Texas, the public library was renamed in 2004 in honor of Larry, who as a former College Station mayor was very active in establishing the library in College Station.



Like his brother, Larry did it all in high school, enjoying both athletics and fine arts as a 4-year letterman. He was class salutatorian, going on to earn a bachelor's degree in mathematics at lowa State, a masters in statistics at lowa State, and then a doctorate of statistics at Texas A&M University.

He joined the Statistics Department faculty at Texas A&M University, going on to be both Assistant Head and Interim Head, and then Professor Emeritus, serving a total of fifty years at the university. His curriculum vitae is pages long of positions, professional awards, university committees he has served on, and publications he has authored.

Among his professional honors are a Distinguished Teaching Award, the H.O. Hartley Award for distinguished service to the discipline of Statistics, and the Paul D Minto Service Award for his contributions to the statistical profession. He has been a past member or president of many professional organizations including the Southeast Chapter of the American Statistical Association.

Like his brother, Larry doesn't mind spending a Saturday flipping pancakes, or serving as a track and field official, but he has been a distinguished member of many community organizations such as the Kiwanis Club, City of College Station council member, and then mayor from 1986-1996, the Texas Library System, Brazos Valley Affordable Housing Corp., a deacon at his church, and in many capacities for the College Station Library. He was named Kiwanis member of the year in 1977.

Today he continues to do consulting on various research projects involving experimental or survey design and data analysis.

Larry says 'I believe the teachers at Mount Vernon High School prepared me for continuing my education, gave me a role model for my career in education, and promoted the sense of serving others.'

Also known as Bernstein, he learned to play cello at age six, and at age 14 picked up the guitar after hearing his first Bob Dylan songs.

Dan says that he took part in every chorus and theater opportunity there was, including in elementary school where "Mrs. Palmer opened us to a lot of different kinds of music, listening and playing. Lois Nichols, Gladys Rife, and Linda Bergman were great music and theater teachers/directors. He earned All-State Chorus twice.

After attending Lawrence University in Wisconsin, Dan began playing open mics every night in Chicago (and going to Wrigley Field during the day). He started landing gigs at Chicago folk clubs and eventually began playing all over North America and Europe, "any place they'd have me." In 1986 he moved from Chicago to Los Angeles, and a few years later began making records and writing songs for movies and TV.

In 2001, NPR interviewed Dan on 'All Things Considered'. NPR wrote 'With his acoustic guitar and a batch of witty and insightful songs, Dan Bern is rapidly becoming the voice of a new generation of folk music."

Among his awards are 'Acoustic Artist of the Year' from the National Academy of Songwriters, the Ralph Gleason Award (founder of Rolling Stone), Best singer-songwriter album for 'Breathe' at the Independent Music Awards, the ASCAP Children's Music Award for 'You Can Do It' from the 'Stinky and Dirty Show,' and shortlisted for a Clio for 'Beauty of a Year,' written for Reddit in 2020. In September (of 2022) Dan was inducted into the Iowa Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Dan has released over thirty albums of original songs, written a dozen books of stories and poems, and a novel, 'Quitting Science.' He has painted thousands of portraits, including a 2017 show of 'Portraits of Iowans' at CSPS in Cedar Rapids. He has had a major role in writing songs for a variety of movies and television and from 2016 to 2019 for 'The Stinky and Dirty Show' on Amazon Prime. He is a frequent song-contributor to the 'The Tony Kornheiser Show', including the recent 'Ballad of Tristan Wirfs.' He co-wrote a song, "Wings of Stone" (sung by Adam Levine) featured in the Judd Apatow film, "The Bubble," released in 2022 on Netflix.

In addition to his own touring Dan has been sharing stories and music in his 'Hunkered in the Bunker' live stream and has his own radio station, Radio Free Bernsteinn, that plays a mix of his music and others 24/7.



Beyond music, he is a lifelong baseball fan, and has won four awards from the New Mexico Newspaper Association for his sports column 'Outtakes from the Bleachers.'

Dan says that "at various times I have been banned from most of the major American folk music festivals, proving Mr. Ringolds' prophetic words, 'Mr. Bern, someday you're gonna get in big trouble for your mouth." Dan laughingly added that once he realized he was nominated for the Alumni Hall of Fame, he said he "intended to pursue it aggressively... jumping over tables, elbowing aside Terry Hormann, Pat Reilly, Steve Sargent, Martha Thompson, and Cindy Viter if need be, to grab the honor and get out of there before Mr. Ringold catches me with it."





Community Impact Hall of Fame recipient Scott Peterson, Class of 1971 was nominated by his sons and Mount Vernon alumni, Evan '99 and Tobyn '00. Evan says that "two words come to mind when many people think of Scott Peterson – service and Mount Vernon."

A life-long resident of Mount Vernon, his father Clifford '44, he, and his sons Evan '99 and Tobyn '00 all attended Mount Vernon schools. Scott is well known around the community for his active involvement in organizations while his children were growing up, but more importantly for his service to the community while both a mayor and councilman, in addition to his position as Mount Vernon's city attorney for over ten years.

Scott graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1975, later attending the University of Iowa for his law degree. After the Naval Academy, Scott went to naval flight school and was assigned to fly SH-2 Seasprite helicopters in the Pacific. When his Naval obligation was done, he continued in the Iowa National Guard as a UH-1 Huey helicopter pilot, later served as the executive officer of an infantry battalion, and completed his military career as a state command JAG officer, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1998 after 26 years of military service.

While in the guard, he was hired by the Linn County Attorney's office. After nine years there, he entered private practice, eventually bringing him to the position of Mount Vernon city attorney in which he served for ten years. He then resigned from that position to run for City Council In 2007. Scott served a term on the council and was then elected mayor in 2011.

In addition to his work at the federal, state, county, and city levels, Scott has a long history of volunteer activism and service in the Mount Vernon community, including at different times being a member of the Parks and Recreation Board, organizer and coach for youth basketball, founder and chair of the original community center committee, chair of the housing commission, member of fire station site committee, member of the Booster Club, and member of the American Legion Post.

An interesting note from Scott is that his great grandfather moved to Mount Vernon from Illinois to be the principal and superintendent of the school, leading to three generations of Petersons as Mustangs – father Clifford Peterson '44, Scott '71, and the third generation Scott's sons Evan and Tobyn.

Athletic Hall of Fame recipient Steve Goodall, class of 1983 was nominated by his wife, Michelle Goodall.



An amazing addition to the Athletic Hall of Fame, Steve was a high school four-sport athlete in football, wrestling, track, and baseball. He earned 11 varsity letters, and was a member of seven conference championship teams – four wrestling, one football, and two track. Eight times he was named a First Team All-Conference athlete, was a state qualifier in wrestling during his senior year, earned honorable mention All-State Football twice, and was a junior national qualifier in wrestling.

High school teammate and MV High School teacher Shawn Voigt '86 says "Steve has been an indispensable friend, an accomplished athlete, and a successful educator as a teacher, coach, and principal. He was talented, but to succeed he needed to work, have discipline, and bounce back from adversity. To me, he embodied the term student-athlete and is a shining example of why athletics can be so valuable."

After high school Steve went on to attend Cornell College, majoring in history and secondary education. He attended the University of Northern lowa to earn a Master of Administration in Secondary Education and is currently principal of the Compass Alternative High School for Linn Mar and Marion School Districts.


As a Cornell College Ram, Steve was a four-year member of the wrestling team, where he earned four individual conference championships, one of only eight wrestlers in Cornell's history to achieve this. Before graduating Steve ranked 15th at Cornell with 73.1 career win percentage, was named an NCAA Wrestling All-American, and was the recipient of the Paul K. Scott Senior Male Athlete of the Year. Steve was inducted into the Cornell College Hall of Fame in 2015. During his four years, Steve was a member of 4 Midwest Conference Championship Teams and helped his team to an impressive four consecutive NCAA Top 25 finishes. Formre Cornell coach Steve DeVries says:

"You are aware of Steve's accomplishments and honors as a Mount Vernon and Cornell College student and athlete. These are impressive and among the reasons he was honored as Cornell's Male Athlete of the Year in 1987 and was elected to the Cornell Hall of Fame in 2015. However, I believe what often does not appear evident in these honors are matters of character.

I taught and coached hundreds of young people in my 35 years at Cornell College. Steve stands among the very best as a talented and dedicated student and athlete. As a college wrestler he committed himself to becoming more than a competitor and winner. He was a team leader in work ethic, leadership, and loyalty to coaches and teammates. He knew how and when to support his teammates and carried through on that support. That capacity for loyalty and commitment has certainly served him well in his career as an education professional."

In high school Steve was also a participant in Mount Vernon's Fine Arts programs as well. He was a two-year member of the choir and also of the cast or crew of *Our Town, Annie Get Your Gun,* and *Fiddler on the Roof*.

To hear the people involved tell the story, it doesn't seem possible 50 years have passed since the Mount Vernon Mustangs basketball team made history and won the state championship, but the facts are the facts. It was mid-March of 1973, months shy of a half a century ago, when head coach Bob Landis led the first team from Mount Vernon to win the state championship in its history. It became clear early on in the '73 season this was no ordinary team, led by no ordinary coach.

Success soon found the coach and the team, and the pieces of the 1973 championship team began falling into place the season before.

THE BIG YEAR

Christine Hanson Starkweather '73 remembers the year fondly. The team was slowly — and decisively — winning each game they played, rated tops in Class A, and excitement started to build. "It was kind of a big deal, all the way through the whole season. For them, and for Mr. Landis, I'm sure," Starkweather said. "The whole school was just really excited. And really backing the team, and supporting them. There were big turnouts at the games," she recalled.

"The places were always packed," said Kerr '73. "As we went along and won games, and with quite a bit of ease, there was always in the back of your mind that would end. That you could get upset," Kerr said. Still, they were beating teams by a large margin every game, and Coach Landis was undeterred. The closest a team had come to beating them all year was Wyoming, the coach said, who lost to the Mustangs by seven points. "Other than that, nobody was even close."

In early March, the team learned they were truly going to represent their school at the state tournament at Des Moines' Veterans Memorial Auditorium. "It was almost 'Hoosier'-like," Kerr said of the town's mood during the tournament. "Because everybody would close downtown. There wasn't much else going on." "When state happened, I think they called off school, and let us go down to Des Moines to watch the games. It was a really big, big deal," Starkweather recalled. "The whole town was pretty much excited about it at that point." Kerr remembers the view from the bus on the ride to Des Moines. "I remember coming up the incline south of town where you can actually turn around and see all the way down Highway 1. I turned around, and it was solid cars and that's when I thought, 'Wow, that's a caravan!'"

Coach Landis, at 90, seemed to have the clearest recollection of the experience in Des Moines of all. "We went there the first of the week," he said. "The first game was on Tuesday, and we stayed there the whole week and left Sunday morning. "It was a great experience for the kids, as well, because they got to eat out at restaurants and go downtown," said Landis. This isn't to say the week was perfect. Star player Phil Rilett '74, a junior, came down with a bad stomach bug, and was unable to participate much in the tournament. Walking into Vets Auditorium for the first time, said Landis, "was an experience, to say the least." The team defeated Belmond in the first round 73-66. A Friday night matchup with Solon ended with the Mustangs winning 75-56, and advancing to the championship the following night. They found themselves toe-to-toe with the number three-ranked H.L.V. Saturday evening, the only other undefeated team. A team with a perfect season had never won the state championship before. Whoever won would change all of that. Mount Vernon and H.L.V. played a tight game all night that went into overtime. The Mustangs were largely without the ill Rilett, and Jeff Werling, '73 another stalwart for the team, was called for four fouls in the first half. "It was the poorest game we played all year," Coach Landis said. Nevertheless, the Mustangs scraped by 67-64, and changed lowa basketball history. The team was welcomed back to the school as heroes the following day, with a 2 p.m. rally in the school gymnasium at which the mayor spoke.

Hal Hufford and Jeff Werling were selected for the all-tournament team. Following the tournament, Kerr remembered his coach and teacher, whom he described as "sharp as a tack" and "emotional", was clearly proud of their accomplishment. Eventually, the team graduated, and began to spread out around the country, with players like

Rilett and Werling going on to play at the

collegiate level.

Sadly, the team was without two of its key players in Randy Rundle '74 and Hal Hufford 73 at the 50th celebration. Rundle passed away two years ago, while Hufford passed in the last year. Hufford was represented by younger brother Mike Hufford '79.

Fellow 1973 classmate Kevin Smith purchased mini "Mount Vernon Mustangs" basketballs the team threw out to the December 3rd crowd.

Christine Rebhuhn, now a New York artist, has been commissioned to create artwork to hang in the enryway at the new Buresh Wellness Center in Mount Vernon. This picture shows her proposal of the finished piece.





Rebhuhn said that she estimated the final piece could be in the neighborhood of 500 pounds in weight. The piece will use an 1890 Steinway grand piano, provided by classmate Zach Bostwick '05. Rebhuhn did a previous piece with a piano that Bostwick provided after they met in April 2020. That piece led to Rebhuhn opening her first solo exhibit in New York City in 2021. "That piece marked a significant turning point in my career," Rebhuhn said, in background on the piece. "That chance encounter, which seemingly happens a lot in Mount Vernon, changed the course of my work, and I am forever imprinted by that series of events."

At the Monday, Nov. 21, city council meeting, council member Craig Engel said he was excited about this piece. "The council has always wanted to promote local artists, patrons and merchants," Engel said. "Even when we're looking for large pieces of art, we want people who have connections and roots to the area." Council member Paul Tuerler appreciated Rebhuhn documenting the creation of the piece as well, to help people years later remember and connect to the piece and why it was installed.

From being underrecruited out of high school to going undrafted in the 2022 NFL Draft, it would have been easy for Jack Cochrane to give up on his football dreams. But quitting has never been in the 23-year-old linebacker's DNA. His perseverance paid off as he now plays for the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs.

Growing up in Mount Vernon, Cochrane's love of sports came naturally as he participated in multiple different activities for much of his life. Thriving on competition, he got his fill playing with and/or against future college and NFL stars like offensive lineman Tristan Wirfs, offensive lineman Tyler Linderbaum, quarterback Cam Miller and linebacker Adam Bock. Surrounded by so much talent in a 10-mile radius, Cochrane said it all comes from how people in the area are raised. "There is just a unique environment of people around Solon and Mount Vernon," Cochrane said. "There are a lot of really good families and kids raised with the expectation that they are going to do the right things and try their best. As a result, you see an unusual amount of success come out of that area." Unfortunately, it can be difficult to catch the eyes of big colleges when you're from a small town.

This was the case for Cochrane, who found that as his high school career with the Mustangs was coming to an end, college offers were few and far between. "I was pretty unrecruited coming out of high school," Cochrane said. "I was playing safety, running back and wide receiver, which were not positions a lot of colleges thought I was going to play. I got an offer from South Dakota, and I ended up taking it."

Playing at the college level presented a challenge of its own. The Coyotes' coaching staff wanted him to transition to linebacker. "Obviously, it was different because I had to learn how to read the line of scrimmage and react quicker because there was less space, but I would say that I adapted decently well." That experience playing both positions paid off for Cochrane as he went on to have a remarkable career at South Dakota. In addition to being voted a team captain three times, he racked up 327 tackles (sixth most in program history), 23 tackles for loss, five sacks, four interceptions and 10 pass deflections.

As a senior, he was named MVFC (Missouri Valley Football Conference) Scholar Athlete of the Year, was selected to the first-team MVFC All-Academic Team, and was a first-team All-MVFC selection.

Cochrane did not hear his name called during the 2022 NFL Draft. Familiar with the feeling of being overlooked, Cochrane said that rather than let it get him down he had to adapt. After hearing offers from several NFL teams who hoped to sign him after the draft, Cochrane decided that the Kansas City Chiefs were the best fit for him. "Going through the pre-draft process, I got to speak with different coaches and other staff members around the organization," Cochrane said. "The values that people here have really spoke to me. Obviously, the level of success that they have had over the past decade spoke for itself. So this was something that I wanted to be a part of and I have loved it since I have been here."

Cochrane did not make the team's initial 53-man roster but was signed to Kansas City's practice squad. He was activated Sept. 13, a moment that brought him short-lived excitement. "It was cool, but I knew that I had to get back to work," Cochrane said. "Obviously, it was something that I have dreamed about since I was a kid, but it was a short moment. It was great to know that I was going to play in an NFL game, but I knew that I had to prepare and be ready to go. The old adage is that the NFL stands for 'Not For Long' so if you do not go out there and prove you belong every week, you are missing out on an opportunity. " Cochrane registered his first career tackle during the Chiefs' Week 4 Sunday night game against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The most memorable moment of the night may have come after the game when Cochrane caught up with his lifelong friend Tristan Wirfs, a Tampa Bay offensive lineman.

Cochrane said it felt like a culmination of both players' hard work. "It was a pretty surreal moment," Cochrane said. "I have played every sport with Tristan since we were four or five years old. So I cannot really explain how that

moment felt, but it was an incredible feeling knowing what we have both been through. Yes, we had different journeys, but to end up in the same place for the first time since high school was pretty special. It is a moment I am going to hold in my heart for a long time."

Well aware that his days in the NFL could end at any time, Cochrane said he is doing his best to make the most out of every day. "I am a pretty short-term goals kind of guy," Cochrane said. "I focus more on coming in each day and making the most out of them. I believe that if you can make the most out of the process, the results will take care of themselves. Of course, I want to be in this league for a long time and be a big contributor on not only special teams but on this defense too. But I think if you get too wrapped up in that stuff it will drive you crazy. So I just try to work my butt off and make the most out of each day."

us this information. Randy says "I thought I would share this if you want to use it in your next publication. I know Austin was a great boys basketball player at Mount Vernon High School in his time there!"

In July, 2022, Randy wrote "Austin Ash, a former Mustang, great in the sport of basketball, has now completed his basketball career at the University of Iowa under Coach Fran McCaffrey, received a full-ride scholarship to play his final collegiate year of eligibility at the Citadel, and is likely to be a point guard for their team in the 2022-23 basketball season. He was a preferred walk-on at Iowa to begin his basketball venture for the Hawkeyes and did receive a full-ride scholarship this past year as he concluded his career for the Hawkeyes.

Austin is currently headed to Charleston, South Carolina to play ball at the Citadel. His offensive prowess and shooting abilities made him a clear cut choice for this Division 1 university to have him compete in this final year of collegiate competition. The Bulldogs of Citadel, one of the oldest universities in the country, opened its prestigious existence in 1899 and they are members of the Southern Conference, SoCon. Head Coach Ed Conroy wants Austin to be a key member of the squad and is well known for his coaching — most recently at Vanderbilt and Minnesota where he was a premiere assistant coach at both institutions.

So Austin Ash goes from a Mustang to a Hawkeye and now a Bulldog as he competes this season at a Division 1 program here in the USA. Best wishes, Austin Ash!"

Editor's Note: At Mount Vernon Austin was First Team All-Conference, All-District and Second Team All-State his senior year under coach Ed Timm... averaged 23 points, 6.4 rebounds, 3.5 assists, 2.5 steals, and one block as team captain his senior season... holds the school record for most 3-pointers made in a career (140).

At the Citidel it is now mid-season and Austin has become the team's most versatile player -- leading with both minutes played and scoring. Austin averages 15 points per game, shoots 38% from the floor, 37% on 3 pt shots, and 90% from the free throw line. The team is 7-11 on the season with thirteen games left on the 2023 schedule. In December, 2022, The Citadel got a career-high nine three-pointers from Austin as the Bulldogs nearly erased an 11-point second-half deficit before falling, 75-70, to opponent Longwood. Austin scored a career-high 27 points on 9-of-17 shooting from beyond the arc. He knocked down six of his three-pointers in the second half.


