

Tristan Wirfs to Receive 'Mustang Outstanding Achievement Hall of Fame' Recognition

Join us as the Alumni Association honors Tristan Wirfs from the Class of 2017 with a 'Mustang Outstanding Achievement Hall of Fame' award on July 10th at 6 pm on the Heritage Days main stage.

As a Mustang in high school, Tristan was known not only as a great athlete, but as a great guy. As a senior he was elected to the U.S. Army All-American Bowl, named to Des Moines Register Élite all-state team, named captain of 2A lowa Newspaper Association all-state team, named district offensive line MVP and Class 2A Iowa Preps Offensive Lineman of the Year, and earned first-team all-district for three straight seasons. He was a 3-year football letterman as both an offensive and defensive lineman and then a team captain as a senior. Tristan was named the Des Moines Register All-Iowa Boys High School Athlete of the Year in 2016-17 and he was also a state champion in discus and shot put as a junior and senior and a won state wrestling championship as a senior. He earned the Robert Kramme Award for most outstanding boys high school performer at 2017 Drake Relays.

As a Hawkeye for the University of Iowa, Tristan was a three-year starter and the first true freshman to start at offensive tackle under head coach Kirk Ferentz, according to Hawkeyesports.com. Wirfs started all 13 games in 2019, 10 at right tackle and 3 at left. He was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten, earned First-Team All-American honors by multiple outlets and was an All-Big Ten selection his junior year.

Now as an NFL American League Tampa Bay Buccaneer, he is an offensive tackle. He was selected in the 2020 NFL draft in the first round, 13th pick, where he would be blocking for the G.O.A.T., Tom Brady. During the nine months from draft day when Tampa Bay was on the doorstep of winning the Super Bowl, Tristan was the only player on the Bucs


An accomplishment you are proud of?







For more than two decades, Jim Wallace from the Mount Vernon class of 1965, has been one of the faces of the Lisbon-Mount Vernon Ambulance Service. He was recognized for his 25 years of volunteer service at a reception on May 11, 2021.

Wallace joined the service in 1996, and his contributions have run the gamut from maintenance of the first ambulance shed to leadership in the LMVAS fundraising and volunteer committees.

Wallace contributed more than 100 hours a week with the LMVAS be- ing on-call for a number of years for the service, more than four days out of every week. That's meant numer- ous times where he has had to respond when a pager goes off to run an ambulance call to help provide medical care to a Lisbon or Mount Vernon citizen in need.

Wallace has been instrumental in ensuring facilities match a growing service, for example, adding a lounge area to the LMVAS shed, which allows volunteers who are on call a place to sleep or decompress between calls.

Wallace was also influential in determining the model that will work best for the LMVAS service with having a full-time paid EMS director who helps staff the volunteer crews for the service, as well as participates in calls as needed.

LMVAS director Jake Lindauer noted the average length of a career for a volunteer paramedic is usually six years, which Wallace has more than quadrupled.

Wallace is still participating on calls with the service to this day and encourages people to consider serving as an EMT. "There have been a number of times when I've arrived on a call and heard 'Boy, I'm glad you're here,' as it's nice for people to see a face they know when they're facing a medical emergency," Wallace said.

We are thrilled to continue our fundraising efforts for a multi-activities complex on the district campus. The proposed project will be located north of the high school and will include the following:

- 1 An eight-lane track and competition space for field events
- 2 A turf field for football, soccer, marching band, and physical education classes
- 3 Seating for approximately 1500 spectators, a concession/restroom building, and a possible team room

The project is estimated to cost approximately \$4 million, and will be funded through a combination of district funding and private donations. Completion of the project is tentatively scheduled for August of 2023 - just in time for our current 6th graders, the Class of 2027, to begin their high school journey.

Our goal with fundraising is to close the funding gap and do all that we can to offset the district's investment in the project, allowing those funds to be directed to other worthwhile school initiatives. Fundraising efforts will continue through completion of the facility, and multi-year commitments are allowed.

We are pleased to announce that we are nearing \$1 million in gifts and commitments thus far. We are excited for this facility to serve our kids and community, and we look forward to working with our Mount Vernon community near and far to help make it a reality.



First year favorite memory: "During my first year, my Spanish classes were on a cart that I wheeled around the entire old high school, current middle school. I had classes in 4 different rooms. The tiny space between the Spanish and German rooms was my "office" that housed everything I had and my cart. When I started, it had never been cleaned out from the previous Spanish and German teachers. I had to do a thorough cleaning and requested a new metal cabinet. They got one for me and it was promptly organized with necessary items including: video cameras and cassettes, audio recorders and cassettes, computer, clothing, plastic food, art supplies, children's books in Spanish, magazines, games from home, maps, flags, and all my Spanish regalia that I had collected over my years of travels. My classes never lacked in hands on

learning. Everything we learned was learned through practical application as much as possible. I was used to moving around, so my students got used to it as well.

We did cooking demonstrations, scavenger hunts, dramatic videos, audio-recordings like radio shows, fashion shows, games outside, dramas for the elementary children and the local preschool, raised money and collected supplies for victims of Hurricane Mitch and children in Latin America, developed Pen Pal relationships with students in Nicaragua, started planning for our first trip to Mexico, went out to eat with Spanish Club, learned to dance, and we learned so much Spanish we were amazed. Once as I was wheeling that cart with books, magazines and art supplies down the ramp into the commons, everything on the cart went in the middle of the stairs! All the students were running around trying to avoid slipping on the stuff! Crazy! I was glad when after 2 years I was able to be located in a room at last!"

Another teacher or staff member who was a mentor or helped you in your career and what did they do that was helpful to you? Neila Sneller was the Spanish teacher I joined, and she and I worked very closely together developing a 4 year sequence of learning that made sense and covered what we felt was needed. She had just had a baby, so I ended up helping out with a lot of the extra organizational things. She helped acquaint me with the textbook curriculum we were using at the time. I used the textbook as a good curricular resource, but really taught lessons and developed activities without the text. Tom Wilkinson helped me develop an 8th grade exploratory that was to include the history of language and culture, and then some of both Spanish and German. Barb Hanson, the secretary at the time, helped me learn the ropes – the ins and outs of everyday activities such as the computers, attendance, how to get a sub, how to claim space in the school. She made me feel at home. Bob Meeker helped me understand the loneliness of being a good high school teacher. He told me that if you are there at the beck and call of students, it was not easy to have much time with the other staff. Suzette Kragenbrink and Vicky Wieseler were my go-to persons in the

library, a place that I used to frequent. Ruth Michaud helped me understand that by making a challenging curriculum that included good solid learning in language and culture, as well as particulars that I was passionate about, I would not only be a better teacher, but I would be true to myself. My promise to myself was that if I were to continue to teach Spanish language and culture, I would take students to countries abroad so they could learn first hand what it means to be bilingual, and so their world and cultural perspectives would be forever broadened and changed.

One or two memories of events that happened during your career at Mount Vernon that you would share. Once my first students made the trip to Mexico, I realized a trip every other year was not going to be enough. Since that first trip, I took students to a Latin American country every year for a total of 21 trips. The countries we visited included Mexico, Spain, Guatemala, Belice, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, Ecuador, and Peru. Every trip changed the lives of the travelers in amazing ways. They became more independent, more open-minded, deeper thinkers, and passionate about becoming bilingual and using the language in travel and eventual careers.

What has changed in education? I have been teaching Spanish long enough to see fads in teaching come and go. Our system to report grades has changed. Some like it and some do not. I was fine with the changes. I would say what has not changed is the importance of teaching for the best success of the students. In languages that includes skills in the presentational mode-speaking and writing, interpretive mode-understanding when listening or reading, and in the interpersonal communication mode, all within the framework of authentic culture.

Retirement Plans: This was an unplanned retirement, until the confluence of COVID19 and my daughter's pregnancy. Winry was born just before the end of the first semester, and I began caring for her so Julia could continue her important and necessary work taking care of seniors in a care center. I am continuing to use my Spanish daily, and am working on German and some Japanese.

Parting Words: It has been an honor to serve the young people of the Mount

Vernon and Lisbon School Districts. I feel like the school has been my home, and the faculty my family. Some of my most valuable and memorable experiences were: the consistent dedication and hard work of the students, the crazy and creative video, audio, and art projects the students produced each year, the volunteer projects seniors completed every year, supporting 4 Latin American Children through the NGO Child Fund International since 2005, taking students monthly to JFON (Justice For Our Neighbors) to help with legal services for immigrants also since 2005, raising and sending \$6000 worth of goods in a truck bound for Honduras following hurricane Mitch, designing and carrying out the Annual International Day with the Spanish Club, traveling to 10 different countries over the course of 21 trips in 22 years, working with 7 different colleagues in the language department during my 25 years, writing and performing fairy tales for the elementary classrooms and the Mount Vernon preschool, coaching one of the finest Cross Country teams in the state of lowa (every year we had one or two teams make it to compete in the state meet, or individual competitors in a recent year), and working with the finest group of educators for which anyone could have wished. Muchas gracias por todo!

When Susan and I were cocoordinators of this club, we had regular after school/evening/holiday activity events, which included: open gym, dances, wrestling room dodgeball, karaoke, ping pong tournaments, crafts, student operated concession stand, etc... These events showcased the students who wanted to set up, decorate, organize and operate the activities, learn how to count money, and be a part of something bigger than themselves. I have many fond memories over the years of these activity events.

What has changed in education? Soooo many things have changed: grading, technology, curriculum, demands on the classroom teacher - some for the better, some for the not so good, but one thing that has not changed is our clientele: the kids!!
